Puketapu School is one of two full primary schools in Bell Block, a rapidly growing suburb to the north of New Plymouth. We have an amazing location, great, spacious grounds, close to the sea and the walkways, allowing us to celebrate and appreciate what is special about the place we live.



Opened in 1980, we are a young school, but we are very proud of our place in our community.

Puketapu is a very special place and we are looking forward with excitement to the next chapter.



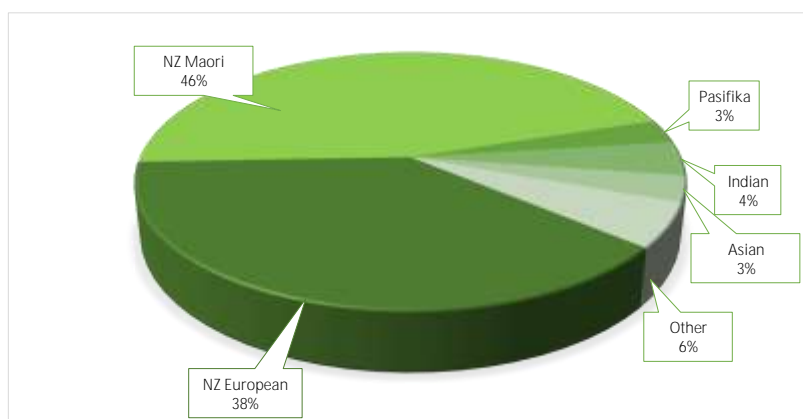
